No proposals on how the new tax revenues would be designated for future uses should the measure pass were presented, and no votes were taken on a course of action, including actions that Jack suggested.

Jack is also the designated election officer for the tax increase proposal, and he submitted the following ballot wording that was passed unanimously by the board:


> "Shall Tri-Lakes Monument FireProtection District taxes be increased \$1,034,208 annually, or by such amount as may be raised by the imposition of an ad valorem property tax rate of 3.00 mills, being an increase from 8.50 mills to 11.50 mills, to be certified in 2012 and collected in 2013. And continuing

each year thereafter as otherwise allowed by law, which increase shall be for funding the general fund of the district to provide proper fire protection, emergency response, and safety for the residents, property owners and businesses of the district including:

"Offsetting decreases in tax revenue resulting from lower assessed values of property within the district, maintaining current staffing levels, maintaining fire protection and EMS vehicles and equipment, maintaining stations, real property, facilities or equipment as necessary to ensure the safety of the community;

"Shall the proceeds of such taxes and any investment income thereon be collected and spent by the district as a voter [sic] voter-approved revenue change in 2013, and in each year thereafter without regard to any spending, revenue-raising, or other limitations contained within Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution, or Section 29-1-301, Colorado Revised Statutes, and without limiting in any year the amount of other revenues that
