
Art Hoppers find wide range of works

Black Forest AARP volunteers aid Flying W Ranch repairs

Several volunteers from the Black Forest AARP Chapter 1100 assisted in the effort to repair fire damage at the Flying W Ranch area that was recently devastated by the Waldo Canyon Fire. The Aug. 18 volunteer effort was planned and supervised by the Coalition for the Upper South Platte. The work involved removal and chipping of burned hazard trees, reshaping the ground surface, reseeding, mulching, and building erosion control structures to stabilize drain-

ages prone to flooding.

Early on, the volunteers provided traffic control and check-in of the volunteer work force. Later they assisted in the hauling of burnt slash to the shredding truck. Finally they helped in the reseeding of a devastated hillside.
