Hale said that he would like to begin outreach to other nearby communities to make slash removal services available throughout the year.

Hale also said that the membership meeting in January will have a new format, with a State of Woodmoor presentation followed by opportunities to speak to board members about their responsibilities. The food will

Finally, Hale said that the association's new attorney, Leonard Rioth, suggested that WIA not attempt to change its covenants because the organization evolved from three small areas to one large one and combining them may result in legal difficulties. The board approved






